Sunday School Dec-2020-May-2021

- We had our 2020 Christmas program and we assigned roles and practiced the day before the program. This was due to the uncertainty with who would be available due to COVID and quarantine.

- Trish led crafts and her and Heidi worked to fill in and get creative to accommodate higher numbers than we had expected.
- Lisa was at registration and floated where she was needed each day.
- Joni was in the pre-school room and there were 12-17 3-year and 4-year olds each day.
- Pastor David and Jenny were there each day to assist where needed
- We had other adult and teen volunteers that gave their time to make it a great week for the kids.

Sunday School Sep-2021 – present

- We started back to Sunday School on September 19, 2021.
- This year has been just in person, not online as of now.
- We have had from 10 kids to around 30 kids depending on the Sunday.
- We finished with our curriculum of the Old Testament that we started last year. We have now moved on to the 10 commandments that we will continue through the second half of the year.
- We will be having a Christmas Program on December 12, 2021 during the 10am church service.

Before school started, we met as a youth committee and talked about the coming year. We decided to split the youth group between guys and girls since we had a solid group of guys coming and felt they needed a male leader. We reached out to Cole Hamre and asked if he would be willing to lead this group of guys. He was very willing and eager to work with the guys and help them grow in their walk with the Lord. Jenny and Shania have been leading a girls' study with one youth, and we ask you to pray for more to come. We are going through Galatians right now, but plan to start the study "Lies Young Women Believe and the Truth that Sets Them Free" after the first of the year. We are still fundraising and working to get our funds back up. One fundraiser right now is the annual fruit sale! 2021 Community Thanksgiving Dinner Report

In response to the positive reception of the first free Thanksgiving Dinner, launched in 2019, the congregants of United Free Lutheran decided to provide the free meal again in 2020. The format looked different than the first year, mainly due to government mandates in place attempting to control the COVID-19 pandemic. The biggest adjustment was that all meals were pickup or delivery only; no dine-in was available.

Despite this, we served 345 meals. Orders could be placed ahead-of-time through the church website, where orders could be customized to the individual. Pastor David greeted cars as they pulled into the parking lot, and transferred names and orders via walkie-talkie. The information was then relayed runners who brought meals out to the vehicles. Servers were kept busy loading to-go boxes, and delivery drivers left around noon.

The planning committee is finalizing preparation for another free dinner this year, and is anticipating the same number of guests to partake. Dine-in eating is available again through reservation, which can be placed on the church website, and take-out and delivery options are again available. This is the first year we are offering deliveries to Middle River. The meal remains the same as the previous two years: turkey, ham, corn, stuffing, mashed potatoes, gravy, cranberries, a dinner roll, and dessert. Meals are only customizable by meat choice, unless there are medical restrictions.

Our prayer is that those who would be blessed by this meal would indeed come or allow us to deliver. “We love because He first loved us,” 1 John 4:19, continues to be our theme verse for this event. May those who need to know our Savior’s love catch a glimpse of it through this Thanksgiving meal, which is only possible through the grace of God.

This past year was a fairly quiet year for the cemeteries, which is always a good thing. We had four burials this year:

As for maintenance and upkeep, this year went very well. There wasn't much mowing to be done with the drought. We did some brush cleaning this spring at the Zion Cemetery in the northwest corner, and will do another portion of it next spring. I also had three more headstones that were laid, one of which was a previously unknown grave that was identified.

In regards to project updates, we got the display boxes made and maps printed off, so they can be installed next spring. Also, with funds available now, we'd like to purchase flag poles for the three cemeteries that don't have (Bethania, Old Bethania, & Pauli). I tried calling some companies last winter on getting prices but never got anywhere, so will continue looking. Pricing will depend upon height and product material. If enough funds remain, we'll look at installing some granite benches as well. If anyone has any other ideas, feel free to contact myself or anyone else on the board, we're always looking for more ways to improve our cemeteries.
