Sunday School Sep-2022-May-2023

- Our attendance for each day was 40-50+ kids and it was great to see kids from the community and other local churches in attendance.
- We were (again) blessed with volunteers to step up and help where needed.
- VBS ended Wednesday night with a program where the kids were able to show what they had learned through lessons and through songs.

- Sunday school resumed September 17th, 2023.
- This year will be lessons on the Apostles' Creed.
- We have an older group of kids than we have previously had, so we are trying to work more in learning the Books of the Bible and where to find them.
- We will have the Christmas Program December 10th, 2023, at 10am during the church service.

Kids Club Report 2023

The Kids Club started in 2023 on February 1 and ran through April 12. We had a program and light supper the last night. There were a total of 31 kids with about 12 being nonmembers. We studied the New Testament and the life of Jesus and his disciples. We memorized a total of nine verses - some with actions and some with music. We run kids club with different stations: music, lesson, games, snack, and craft.

This fall kids club started on October 4 and will run six weeks through November 8. Again we have a total of 31 kids registered with about 9 from other churches or unchurched families. We are studying the book of Acts with Answers in Genesis curriculum. We are encouraging kids/families to read through the book of Acts and memorize verses. We started an award system this fall and kids can earn points from: coming, bringing their Bibles (some didn't have/own a Bible so we have given out a number of Bibles to these families), reading Acts (or listening to it through the Bible.is app) and memorizing scripture verses. We eliminated craft time so we could use our resources to buy prizes for those who choose to earn points. We keep changing things in Kids Club to meet the needs of the kids and/or encourage them. There is a lot in the world that distracts or takes time away from the Lord. We need to help our kids find that balance and always put God first.

We are thankful for each child the Lord gives us and we earnestly pray that they will "be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth" I Timothy 2:4. We want them to walk with Christ their whole life through.

One change this year is that no meat preferences will be taken to help keep operations simple and more efficient.

This year's upcoming meal is available for pick-up, delivery, and open dine-in. Orders can be placed ahead of time through the church website or by phone, and walk-ups are welcomed.
