2021 AFLC Annual Conference

Although we are planning to be at a family reunion over Independence Day weekend, we did already attend a family reunion. This reunion was the Association of Free Lutheran Churches' Annual Conference at the Free Lutheran Schools' campus in Plymouth, MN, June 16-19. It was encouraging to see brothers and sisters in Christ from our association of churches, both pastors and lay people.

The Conference is not all business—it is interwoven with prayer times, devotionals, worship services, and teaching times. Maybe you are wondering, "So what orders do we have for our church from the big wigs at the Conference?" None. This is because each church, including United, is treated as it should be: independent from any human rule, which includes the Conference. The Holy Spirit and His Word are the rule the church should submit to.

Greetings from the WMF! June has been a busy and exciting month. We helped to feed anywhere from 35-60 kids plus adults each evening during VBS, it is so fun to get to know the kids and learn their likes and dislikes. Thank you to all the ladies who helped prepare and serve food and thank you to the other volunteers, FLBC Zion Team, and youth who took charge of VBS and kept all the little ones learning.

Following VBS, myself and others were blessed to go on the bus tour with the youth to the Bible College, Creation Museum and ARK Encounter. I am sure you will hear about it and see pictures of the experience. We were also blessed to be able to participate in the Women's Day at the Annual Conference on the way home from the trip. What wonderful speakers and memorial to those ladies who passed in the last year.

Teen and preteen camps at Galilee Bible Camp in Lake Bronson wrapped up at the end of June, and we were able to be involved by supplying meals for a day.

We skipped the scheduled June WMF meeting as it was in the middle of VBS. Instead, we will be reviewing both the June and July lessons during our next meeting, July 14. June's study is in chapter 3 of 1 Timothy, and titled "God's Desire for Pastors and Deacons." The lesson states, "In 1 Timothy 2 we saw that God's desires for prayer and the roles of men and women in corporate worship serve His work to save sinners. God's will is that all people would be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth.

The truth is that Christ gave Himself as a ransom for all people. God uses pastors to bring this truth to us."

Lesson 7 for July is from 1 Timothy Chapter 4 and titled *God uses Pastors to Save you*. The lesson states, "We need pastors who help us recognize false teaching and who continually teach us the Bible about our Savior, Jesus Christ. Through the truth that Christ Jesus is the ransom for all sinners, God saves us and keeps us saved."

In August, we will be studying 1 Timothy 5:1-16. This lesson is titled "Instructions for the Church (part1)." The lesson states, "Pastors and churches are called to teach both God's Law and His Gospel according to the Bible. Through sound teaching from the Bible, the Holy Spirit works repentance, faith and godliness in us.

1 Timothy 5 gives specific instruction regarding certain groups of people. These instructions teach us what obeying God's commandments looks like in various life situations. May God bring us repentance, faith and love for others through His Word today."

- AFLC Youth Ministries budget is \$165,400. At the floor of the Conference, this amount was raised \$25,000 above their original subsidy request of \$140,400. Let's keep them in mind so we can keep Dr. Jason Holt, the director of the ministry, at a full-time capacity in serving our churches.
- Parish Education released Volume V of its AFLC Heritage series. One Thing I Seek: Selected Writings of Francis W. Monseth. Dr. Monseth was the dean of our seminary and president of our schools before his passing in 2013.
- The President of the AFLC, Pastor Lyndon Korhonen, will be stepping down in 2022 as he finishes his third term. Pray that the Lord would raise up a replacement.
- Next year's Conference will be hosted at the Association Retreat Center near Osceola, WI.

There's much more that can be said about AFLC Evangelism and Discipleship's redesigned website, World and Home Missions adaptations to COVID restrictions, and other happenings. These plans are voluntary, so they won't automatically happen unless the churches join, since it must be freely, voluntary. If it is done in a free spirit, how much more impactful can it be than fulfilling some "have to's"?







