What is a Heretic, and Can They Be Saved?

My brother, with his friends from a church of an ethnically Finnish denomination, were going to play a pickup game of football at the school one Sunday afternoon. Another group of kids showed up. They were from the other ethnically Finnish local church, which had split from the other church some years back. After both parties agreed to have a game of football, one kid from the second church exclaimed, "Alright, it's us versus the heretics!" The great thing is my brother didn't know what that meant at the time, and he said he would have had it printed on a jersey, if they had those.

Maybe you, like my brother back then, don't know what a heretic or heresy is. Heresy is false teaching, and a heretic is one who teaches that. It is contrasted with orthodoxy, which a church (even a heretical one) desires or claims to have. I decided to focus on this concept of heresy as church membership classes are planned for January and February. We desire in our church to have orthodox teaching— and not just so we can say we agree with United's teaching and are a member, but rather so the Body of United can be safe in Christ.

A heretic could be an unbeliever, but this is not always the case. In his book Heresy, Alister McGrath says, "it is not unbelief; it is rather a vulnerable and fragile form of Christianity that proves incapable of sustaining itself in the long

term" (83). Time will tell, in other words. While "the gates of hell shall not prevail against" the church (Matthew 16:18), those who follow heresy will, years down the road, not find themselves in the true Church, even if they claim it.

We don't condemn all non-Lutherans as heretics. Baptists, Assemblies of God, Covenant...etc. all do vary in specific teachings from AFLC Lutherans, but we acknowledge they, in general, teach the same foundation: Jesus Christ. Heresy, though, poses a large risk of losing that foundation of Jesus Christ. It is not submitting to a name, "Lutheran" or "Christian," whether with a membership or attendance, that saves. It is not by outward connection with a church, but rather by faith in Jesus Christ.

C.F.W. Walther was a 19th century Lutheran who, after his conversion in Germany, did not want to join the Lutheran Church because he thought that they claimed to be the only ones who were saved. He learned that he was mistaken: they claimed to have the only pure teaching and Creeds, but they did not claim to be the only ones saved. "Then I understood that it is not necessary to condemn anyone who is in error regarding some article of the Creed, but only those who have seen their error and still want to stick to it." (Walther, Law and Gospel, 381).

Some do stick to heresy, but they do it unknowingly. Ignorance is bliss, though, isn't it? You don't have to go through all of the work to read the Bible and find correct teaching, right? That may be the case, but it is dangerous. Over time, heresy may not only maim your faith, but kill it. Besides this, the next generation needs faith, and heretics can't pass that on well, if at all. Probably the most obvious sign someone will fall into heresy is when they only learn Christian teaching on their own. For one, they ignore everyone else's interpretation. This can come from a heart of pride, an attitude condemned by the Bible.

Second, the very Bible they are studying tells them that, through this Word, God builds a Body, called the Church. God gifted this Church with "apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers" to teach God's Word, "for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes" (Ephesians 4:12-14). True teaching will unify the Body of Christ, the Church, into a mature, strong group that can weather any false teaching, even while the followers of heresy eventually become shipwrecked.

This is why we go back to the creeds and other teachings in Church membership class. Returning to the basics of orthodoxy, which makes the Church the Church, isn't just slapping a label on yourself through membership, as if you only put on a jersey. It is teaching based on God's Word, which is safe. The orthodox word will last forever, and the gates of hell don't even stand a chance against it.

- 4. Does it draw me closer to Christ or drive me farther away? Romans 6:15-16
- 5. Will it cause others to sin? Romans 14:12-13
- 6. Who am I really trying to please? God or myself? Romans 15:1-3
- 7. Can I ask God's blessing on it? 1 Corinthians 6:19-20
- 8. Would Jesus do it? 1 Peter 2:21-23
- 9. Will I someday be ashamed of what I did? Galatians 6:7-8
- 10. Would I want to be doing this when Jesus returns? Luke 21:34-36, Matthew 24:44

Please join us for this last lesson of the year on Tuesday, November 17th (note date change) at 7 p.m.
