### Why Fear?

"And his mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation" (Luke 1:50). These are the words Jesus' mother Mary exclaimed, rejoicing with her elder relative Elizabeth in hearing she was also pregnant (with whom we would come to know as John the Baptist).

We might wonder about that particular word she said, "fear," since, on the one hand, fear has positive connotations in the Bible, as it does in the verse quoted above. On the other hand, there are verses that described the glorious appearance of angels speaking to the simple shepherds, "Fear not" (Luke 2:10), as they announced Christ's birth. So, should we fear, or not? The circumstances of these verses obviously differ, but let's dig into the concept of fear to help ease our dread of it.

Think about the signs at the zoo, like the one by the lion enclosure, "Do not climb on the wall." For what reason should you not climb this wall? Is it because of the fifth commandment, "You shall not kill," as in, don't kill your own life by giving it to the lions? In other words, that you should fear the lions and their threat to vour life? Or is it because of the fourth commandment, "Honor your father and your mother," who in this instance are the owners and employees of the zoo? Honoring their directions? Fearing what they could do to you if you disobey (like maybe call law enforcement)?

Are these all good reasons to stay out of the lion enclosure? Yes, fear of lions and the authorities can keep you out of the lion enclosure, but there is a greater fear: fear of the Lord.

The Lord commanded both "you shall not kill" and "honor your father and your mother," so your fear is not so much of the lions nor the zoo employees, but of the One who commanded you both of these commands.

Would there ever be a reason to go into the lions' enclosure, though? Yes, remember Daniel chapter 6, when Daniel disobeyed the authorities and was thrown into the lions' den? This was because he didn't fear the lions nor the authorities. He feared God, and his faith—shown in his fear of God—caused him to be thrown into the den.

The fear of the Lord is to be the highest fear, above the fear of lions, authorities and all others. It may keep us out of the lions' enclosure. It may lead us into it. Are you fearing people and threats today? Remember, "his mercy is for those who fear him."

God loves you, and Jesus' perfect love, shown on the cross, drives out these other fears: "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear" (1 John 4:18).
