LIGHT IN DARKNESS 2021

What will be different about this new year for you?

If it is simply *your* time to spend, probably nothing.

If it is according to God's will, there is great hope for an end to all your labors.

See Ephesians 5:15-17 (ESV):

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

"Making the best use of the time" (v.16) may remind you that the clock is ticking, but this pressure doesn't seem to be the only point of this passage. Patience still has its place, and it may take some patience and slowing down to "Look carefully then how you walk" (v.15).

The "then" refers to the

previous verses of Ephesians 5, of the dark life of unbelievers, which should contrast with our "walk" as God's children (5:1-2). We are to "Walk as children of the light" (v.8) and reveal sin, rather than live in the dark. The Lord's will is to reveal with light, so we can "Look" clearly at how we walk.

This darkness of evil in our world is what makes this statement true: "the days are evil" (v.16). That is a basis to walk wisely.

So, take time to pause this new year and "Look carefully how you walk, not as unwise but as wise."

See how Proverbs, well-known as wisdom literature, instructs us:

"But the path of the righteous is like the light of dawn, which shines brighter & brighter until full day.

Thank you, Sunday School Staff The way of the wicked is like deep darkness; they do not know over what they stumble" (Proverbs 4:18-19).

God has set you apart in Christ, and counts you as righteous. He treats you as His child. So, that first part of the Proverbs passage shows God's time for you has a blessed end to your labors.

The darkness around you may deepen, but God's light on your path gets increasingly

brighter.

Think about the book of Judges. Once settled in the Promised Land, the Israelites cycled through periods of forsaking the Lord and needing to be delivered. "The people of Israel did what was evil in the sight of the LORD" is a common refrain in the book, showing, in general, experience did not teach them. "The way of the wicked is like deep darkness; they do not know over what they stumble." Experience alone will not teach us either — since alone, it is without light to reveal the way.

Caught on the hamster wheel of evil days, we get sucked into a haphazard way, like the young man walking near sexual temptation (Proverbs 7:8) or laziness as opposed to the wise ant who worked at the proper time (Proverbs 6:6-11). Even if we find earthly success in diligent labors, we forget to ask, ""For whom am I toiling and depriving myself of pleasure?' This also is vanity and an unhappy business" (Ecclesiastes 4:8).

The "days are evil;" just as you woke up yesterday, worked, and slept, so it will be today. Time may in fact not heal, but actually harden. It may be clear in time, but that time

may be too late.


Time won't change the cycle. Rather, God has in Christmas.

The birth of the Son in the flesh cut into the evil cycle. He is the Light that stepped into

this day-in, day-out, dark world.

How would God change that cycle for you personally? The Word shining light upon you through reading, and vulnerability to let one another examine our lives in the light of God's Word. This is so we can "Look carefully" at our walk this past year. It is so we can move forward in Christ's forgiveness of our wasted time. Maybe it will help you toward your resolutions. Maybe it will change them.

"The days are evil" is a trap to the person without God's light. To the one with God's light, "The days are evil" is only a challenge to one with God's light. Because, shedding God's light upon our walk, the time is redeemed.
