An Organized Mess

I have found it difficult to reconcile the tension between two thoughts shown in the following verses:

First of all, that we should pray "for kings and all who are in authority, so that we <u>may lead a</u> <u>tranquil and quiet life</u> in all godliness and dignity" (1 Timothy 2:3). Then there is 2 Timothy 3:12, which says, "Indeed, all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus <u>will be</u> <u>persecuted</u>."

Paul also said concerning personal life, "...[M]ake it your ambition to <u>lead a quiet life</u> and attend to your own business and work with your hands" (1 Thess. 4:11). Yet, we know Jesus came to earth, not to bring peace, but <u>as a sword</u> that can even divide families (Matt. 10:34-39).

What are we to say?

God created all things good, as is written in Genesis, and we see this still reflected in the creation we enjoy and even in our work, just as Adam and Eve had worked in the garden.

But this perfect creation is still seen only as a reflection in a rearview mirror. Sin messed it up. The world is beautiful, but it is fallen. It is an organized mess. That's why Jesus came and suffered here, in the same mess we live in. He wanted to get us out of the mess.

The world's ability to function in disorder can't last forever, although some live as though it will.

the mess who love sin and are described as being "enemies of the cross of Christ" whose focus is "on earthly things" (Philippians 3:18-19).

This orderly chaos is why Jesus suffered on earth, as we especially remember during Lent.

This is also why we suffer as earth's inhabitants.

Yes, Christians should work hard and attend to their own business, but sometimes the payoff from labor is taken away through persecution.

Yes, Christians should enjoy what God provides richly for them *to* enjoy (1 Tim. 6:17), such as their family. However, family life can get in the way of experiencing joy when not all of the family members trust in Christ.

So, the family is divided without peace, as Jesus predicted. What are we to say? What are we to do?

We can confidently look to Christ and know He also went through this mess, even through death, so He could bring us also through death into life. Therefore, we don't need to seek escape from the mess here — Christ is right in it with us.

As Paul said, "I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am [in] . . . [for] I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:11, 13).

So, are we to suffer or rejoice in our circumstances?

We can do both, knowing that whatever lot we are dealt, or whatever season of life we are in — whether abundance or poverty, difficulty or peace — the tension we experience will only be adequately handled when met in Christ.

A Website for United

You may have heard some rumblings (or simply noticed in the bulletin) that a website is being developed for United Free Lutheran. Well, the rumors are true!

A small group of congregation members presented the idea, along with a sample site, to the Church Council at its January and February meetings. The council approved moving forward with the project, and a committee to oversee it was formed. Committee members include representatives from United's active ministries, along with Pastor David and myself.

The committee is aiming to having the site ready for launch early April.

Some may be wondering why a church website is necessary, which is a fair question. As was shared with the council, when David and I were receiving pulpit inquires last winter, we researched each interested church as we prepared for our visitations. When we tried looking up United, we only found a Facebook page that did not provide much of the church's basic information. In fact, we even had to contact the call committee to find out the time of the worship service; it wasn't posted online.

Obviously, this did not interfere with our being called to become members of the United church family.

While the call process is now done for David and I, there will likely be more new faces moving to the Greenbush area in the future, and they may be interested in learning about the area churches and will be conducting their own research. Plus, some families or individuals may be parting from their current congregation and will want to know more about the other options are available nearby. Could we simply add the worship and Sunday School start times to the Facebook page? Yes, but there is much more to be known about a church other than when its congregation gathers. What doctrine does it follow? What ministries are available? For United specifically, what is the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations? Such questions are likely to come up when individuals are looking to join a new church family, and presenting the answers to those questions in a clear, nonintimidating manner is what the website committee is striving to do.

The hope is that United congregants will also find the website beneficial, such as accessing the calendar and special event webpages, learning what current classes/groups are studying, listening to previous sermons, and being able to give gifts or tithes online.

All in all, the goal is to make the site a hub of information that will help United better serve its community and immediate family.

As a side note, this newsletter template came with the website's host site membership plan.
