# **Review: The Offices of Christ:**


- **1. Prophet:** Prophets speak to the people to guide their lives with God's Word. The last time God spoke to us was during the time of Jesus, as recorded in the Bible. Jesus is the last \_\_\_\_\_\_ (Hebrews 1:1-2).
- 2. Priest: Priests sacrifice and pray for the common people. Jesus was sacrificed on the cross for our sin, and is \_\_\_\_\_\_ for us now (Heb. 7:12)
- **3. King:** The great King David of Israel was promised one of his descendants (in other words, a great-great-great-great-great-...grandson) would rule forever. This is Jesus, who was called the "Son of \_\_\_\_\_."

# Part 4: Humiliation

To exalt someone is to bring them higher. An exaltation is an honor, or the act of bringing someone to a higher rank. Today, we are learning about Christ's exaltation, summarized by the Apostles' Creed.

# The Apostles' Creed's Summary and Explanation of Christ's Exaltation

Apostle's Creed	Explanation
He descended into hell	He preached to those already dead while in hell. We aren't sure what he preached, but he probably declared His victory on the 1 Peter 3:18-19.
The third day He rose again from the dead	Now as he is risen from the dead, Jesus still has a human body, although it is different in some ways from our's. He ate (Luke 24:42), went through locked doors, John 20:19, disappeared from some disciples' sight, Luke 24:31
He ascended into heaven	He did this in the sight of His
And is seated on the right hand of God the Father Almighty	The right hand is the place of 1 Peter 3:22
From where He shall come to judge the living and the dead	2 Corinthians 5:10; Revelation 20:11-15. God will judge everyone by His
