Review: The Offices of Christ:

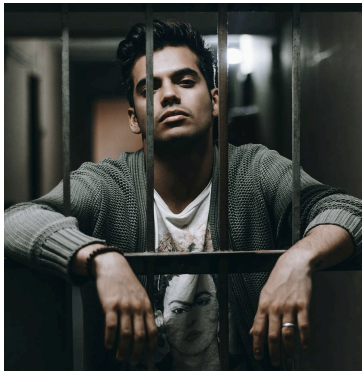

Part 4: Humiliation

He descended into hell...	He preached to those already dead while in hell. We aren't sure what he preached, but he probably declared His victory on the _____. 1 Peter 3:18-19.
The third day He rose again from the dead...	Now as he is risen from the dead, Jesus still has a human body, although it is different in some ways from our's. He ate _____ (Luke 24:42), went through locked doors, John 20:19, disappeared from some disciples' sight, Luke 24:31
He ascended into heaven...	He did this in the sight of His _____.
And is seated on the right hand of God the Father Almighty	The right hand is the place of _____. 1 Peter 3:22
From where He shall come to judge the living and the dead	2 Corinthians 5:10; Revelation 20:11-15. God will judge everyone by His _____.
