resolution.

In addition to a fragmented life of juggling responsibilities, is life in Christ just another commitment to the schedule?

No. Rather, life in Christ, which is the gift of eternal life we have received, affects our lifestyle.

Life responsibilities lie scattered like puzzle pieces, but knowing Christ is our life, given through the Word, is like the puzzle box cover and glue. It gives an example of the full picture of life in Christ, so our lifestyle can be pieced together purposefully, and glues it to weather long-term.

Deuteronomy 6:6-8, "And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."

The term "devotions" is used to describe devoting time each day to God's Word. If we do it as this Deuteronomy passage says, as we walk and talk in our everyday life, we see "devotions" aren't another commitment, but a lifestyle.

In God's Word we realize it's not so much us giving up time for God, but rather realizing, "He who did not spare His own Son but gave Him up for us all, how will He not also with Him graciously give us all things?" (Romans 8:32).

Realize in the Word how Christ's schedule on earth was devoted to you, and it will help glue this fast-paced lifestyle into a beautiful picture.
